

When Lynn Witzenburg's computer programmer career ended due to severe arm pain, she started machine guilting. The machine guilting became a new source of entertainment, and her skills improved. Lynn started receiving requests for hired machine quilting work.

Lynn, lives in Des Moines, Iowa and has twice been juried into Paducah, Kentucky's American Quilter's Society show. She quilts for other professionals such as Marianne Fons, and Liz Porter.

Lynn's lecture will give great tips for choosing the quilting design that compliments your quilt top. Learn to apply her 'no rules' theory.

Labels for Cuddle Quilts

If you are turning in a cuddle quilt, please sew a label to the back of it. This will save Anita from having to

sew a label on each cuddle quilt herself !!

It's easy. Cut a 3" x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle from muslin or white fabric (plain is best). Press under $\frac{1}{2}$ " on all edges. Stitch to the back of the cuddle quilt. That's it. You don't have to write anything on it. When Anita gets your finished cuddle quilt, she'll stamp on your muslin label. She has a stamp that puts all of the LQG information on the label.

- IQSC announces that they will have a visiting faculty fellow who is a folklorist and nationally known quilt scholar giving a presentation on 3/22/06. The topic will be the controversy over the quilt code that supposedly guided the runaway slaves on the underground railroad. The talk will be from 9-10 AM in the Home Econimics Building. - Julie McCulloch will be doing a workshop and program for the Heritage Needlework Guild in Nebraska City and Auburn on April 25th and 26th. More information available on the bulletin board.

Those of you who do complete a guilt are asked to hand stitch a blank white or muslin label to the back of the quilt. Anita will then stamp the label. Dimensions for the label will be in the Plain Print.

C. Bus Trip. Lora Yardley reminded members that the trip is coming up soon. There are six openings available for the trip which will go to Des Moines and Ames, Iowa. They have just learned that the shop in Elk Horn, Iowa will open early for the first stop on the trip.

B. Martha Lane presented the proposed slate of officers for the coming year. C. Membership dues will be due June 1. Mary Werner will be the new membership chairman and she will be available at the next 2 meetings to collect dues. There will no longer be a late fee; however, if dues are not paid by July 1st, the member will not be in the membership book or receive the September newsletter as it takes time to get the information compiled. 



April Friendship Garden Block

The 2005-06 Friendship blocks are all fusible appliqué on cut 6" square backgrounds. Designs are whimsical things found in a garden. You are given two designs each month, however, only one will be printed in the <u>Plain Print</u>. You can make either or both as many times as you wish.

Cut: 6" square for background. Trace pattern and fuse to background.

If you copy the patterns from the Emailed Plain <u>Print</u>, type "Ctrl P" (or on Macintosh computers type P") which will bring up your PRINT MODE page. In the middle of that page is PAPER HANDLING, go to PAGE SCALING and select "NONE" in that box. This will allow you to print the pattern at 100%.

- Place all trades in large "zip-lock type" bag labeled with your name.
