1 fat quarter Holiday fabric

3/4 yd. ribbon or cord for drawstring

- 1. Fold down about 1" along one 22" edge of the fat quarter. Stitch, forming casing.
- Fold fat quarter in half with right sides together should measure about 11" x 17"
- 3. Sew across bottom and up one long side ending at casing.
- 4. Turn right side out. Thread ribbon through casing. Knot ends together




Nebraska State Fair

Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild - September 11, 2006

Becky Haynes, introduced her local small quilt group called the Applebee Quilters. This group consists of twelve active and retired teachers from Lincoln Public Schools. They shared quilts that they have made in monthly projects and for annual celebrations over the past fifteen years.

The business meeting followed.

The minutes of the May 8, 2006, were accepted as printed in the Plain Print, there were no corrections.

The Treasurer's reports was also printed in the Plain Print, there were no corrections. The Treasurer's reports are remanded for audit.

Judy Woodworth class is November 13th, place TBA, cost is \$30.00. It is an all day class. Becky said she will stay after the meeting for those interested in signing up for the two classes.

Problems:

A couple problems have occurred that needed to be brought to the Guild's attention. The written text of Kate's statements to the guild is included in the minutes in order to avoid paraphrasing or summarizing.

Unfortunately, we have had some problems arise in the last few weeks that need to be brought to the Guild's attention.

The first concerns the programs and classes lined up for this year. There has already been grumbling and complaining. One comment made was, "It's not going to be worth even going to the meetings this year!"

As you may recall, we have had 2 vice president-elects resign. Becky agreed to be vice president for me because we are friends. Back in 1996, Becky was President and I was her Vice President. So she took over the job and started looking for programs and classes approximately the 1st of February. Ami Simms was already lined up for October. Becky had the rest of the year to fill.

One thing everyone needs to be aware of is the time factor. Most of what we would consider national teachers are booking classes and lectures 18 – 30 months in the future. That made it hard to line up anyone for this year.

However, Becky did line up Shelly Burge and Brenda Groelz. There is something that many of you may not understand. Shelly and Brenda are both good old Nebraska girls. They are also both national speakers and teachers who have also taught at the international level!!

SOOOOOO, Ami Simms, Brenda Groelz, Shelly Burge, and Betty Lenz.... that makes 4 national speakers at our guild this coming year.

I know everyone has different interests in quilting and different speakers they want to hear speak at Guild, but please be kind to our Vice President and at least give the speakers a chance.

Many of you may have noticed Becky's email address printed on the class sign up forms in the Plain Print. It was an LPS.org address that all teachers in Lincoln Public Schools' have. Becky used this address for her email, BUT ... and here's the important part... she read and did her email at home. This has been the common practice for teachers and other LPS employees who have this email address. I have several friends who teach for LPS and they all said they do the same thing. None of my friends, including Becky, had ever been told this practice was unacceptable.

Now for the second problem. A member of our Guild called the LPS administration office and filed a citizen's complaint against Becky for using this email address for personal use. Becky was contacted by the Administration and told to stop this practice immediately, which she has done. BUT a citizen's complaint was placed in Becky's personnel folder. This is NOT a good thing.

The other part of this problem is that the complaint was made by someone identifying herself (or himself) as part of Lincoln Quilters Guild. It could be inferred that this was on official complaint from LQG and this is inappropriate! Any correspondence representing LQG should come from the Board or should be authorized by the Board.

To wrap this up....

- Correspondence from LQG should come from or be authorized by the Board.
- 2. If you have a problem with something going on in Guild, let's try to resolve it

3. Please talk with your Board. If you have a problem with something going on, there are 8 people on this board. They're listed in the front of your membership book. If you have a problem with one of us and don't want to confront that person, there are 7 other people to talk with.

New Business

Ricky Tims Seminar:

Ricky Tims is coming to Omaha with Alex Anderson and Libby Lehman. Ricky's seminar will be sponsored by the Omaha Guild as a fund raiser for the International Quilt Study Center.

Fabric Exchange:

Susan Johnson Russell, will be in charge of the Fabric exchange. There are three choices of size of fabric you wish to exchange: 9", ¼ yd. (fat quarter), or ½ yd. You will exchange with the size you brought. If there is not a fabric you wish to exchange for, you will receive a ticket to use at a later time. More information will be in the Plain Print.

Quilt Challenge:

Rosalind Carr, Elizabeth Sterns, Joyce Donlan and Judy Lane are the four working on the challenge.

Rosalind said we are to design and make a quilt that our favorite literary character would like.

Elizabeth gave the rules to follow, which are in the packet. Quilts may be turned in early to be viewed by a panel of judges. Or quilts may be brought to the April meeting to be seen and voted on for viewer's choice awards

Joyce gave us a list of the different kinds of books we can choose for our challenge.

Judy showed the three different fabrics for the challenge. There are 60 packets prepared and the fat quarter will come in what looks like a book cover. The cost is \$5.00 each. The rules, the submissions and the forms are in the packet.

Old Business

LQG Quilt Show:

Carolyn Meter reported admissions totaled \$3376 (1,100 paying guest). We sold \$4,471 Raffle Tickets, net Raffle Quilt profit \$4,000.00. The Auction totaled \$5,025. The quilt and dishes donated for the International Quilt Study Center yielded \$283. \$529 was donated to Habitat for Humanity. Total net Quiltfest profit was \$10,140.

Shirley Chaffin, reported on the ticket sales. The most tickets sold were by Bernice Jeffries and Chris Taylor, they each sold 80 tickets. Marilyn Rembolt and Sheila Warren each sold 75 tickets each. Mary Scheele sold 51 tickets and Lin Gowin-O'Brien sold 50 tickets. Shirley promised at the beginning of the ticket sales, those who sold the most tickets would receive fabric.

Sheila Green reported the 450 quilts displayed at Quiltfest were viewed by 1,750 visitors, including the 14 Japanese quilting instructors and other visitors from the national and international quilting community. Visitors commented on the quality of the quilts exhibited, especially noting the Artful Dwelling and 3D House Display.

<u>Habitat for Humanity</u>: Sheila Green has had five small quilts donated and fifteen bed size quilts donated for new Habitat homeowners. More are needed.

State Fair quilt hanging: Sheila reported when she and Linda Gapp took over for Janice Lippincott, she was very pleased with the response she got from her email she sent out for helpers. 19 LQG members and 4 spouses helped hang and take down the quilts. Many other members white gloved.

Discover Nebraska:

Sheila Green said there are 16 presentations booked for this school year. There will be an orientation and workshop to prepare the copy material and a luncheon, September 13th at All Saints Lutheran Church from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. More classroom volunteers are needed.

Cuddle Quilts:

Something new will be tried this year. Kate Laucomer has made several new patterns for cuddle quilts. She gave Sharlee Green two new patterns and fabric to make samples to show. The quilt patterns will be on the website soon. You should be able to download them. For those of you who can't download from the website, there will be patterns on the Cuddle Quilt Table AFTER the meeting. You are asked not to take a pattern if you don't plan on making a cuddle quilt. Anita Ahrens showed 2 new cuddle quilts patterns made by Millie Fauquet, Vicky Skuodas, and kits with these patterns are available at the Cuddle Quilt table.

The meeting was adjourned to Show and Tell.

OCTOBER 2006 "CUT-UP" BLOCK

Martha Lane and Donna Welte have been brain-storming to come up with a new "twist" in the monthly *Friendship Blocks*. This idea is simple and won't require a pattern. Just follow these simple instructions

- Cut one light and one dark (or medium) 6½" square each
- 2. Cut two 3" squares from scrap light fabric and cut two 3" squares from scrap dark fabric. (Should be different from the 6½" squares)









- 3. Draw diagonal lines on the back of the 3" squares. These will be the stitching lines.
- 4. Place the light 3" squares on the darker 6½" square, right sides together (RST) on opposite comers. Sew across the diagonal lines. Repeat with the dark 3" squares on the light 6½" square. (DO NOT TRIM ANY CORNERS)!! The block winners will trim the comers.









- 5. Fold the corner squares back over the seam and press.
- 6. Make as many as you want. You will get a chance for each block you turn in. Use your scraps!











LQG Fabric Exchange Table

- 1. No money is involved (beyond your initial cost for fabric).
- 2. The table will consist of an assortment of fabrics in these sizes:
 - a 9" squares
 - b. 1/4 yards straight cuts or fat quarters
 - c. ½ yards
- 3. You trade one-for-one.
 - a. one 9" square for one 9" square, one ¼ yard for a ¼ yard, one ½ yard for a ½ yard.
 - b. You cannot trade a ½ yard for two ¼ yard pieces or vice versa.
 - c. The trade must be "like for like".
- 4. If you contribute a "unit", but don't find one you want that month, you will be given a coupon to redeem at a later meeting. Coupons do not expire; neither will they be replaced if lost.

LQG NICKEL SWAP

We're still doing the Nickel Swap and you can participate! All you have to do is follow the instructions below.



- ONE YARD 100% pre-washed cotton fabric (28 pairs).
- Yes, you can use yardage from your stash but be kind!
- · We need Darks and Lights as well as Mediums
- · Trim selvages off
- Cut 5 inch squares
- Stack fabric squares in twos alter each pair at a 45 degree angle so it's easy to grab just two at a time.
- Place all trades in large "zip-lock type" bag labeled with your name.
- BRING TO MEETING Pick up your swap (27 pairs) at the following meeting!


