We passed a sign up sheet around at the Guild meeting last night. We still need many, many, many to come quilt. Feel free to drop by the Cosmic Cow any time they are open (except no quilting on March 22 - 24) or call Kate to sign up. Cosmic Cow is also open on Thursday evenings. When you're finished with a piece of thread, pull it through the batting, pull it to the top, and just leave it. We'll clip all of the tails after we take the quilt out of the frame.

Nominations:

We have 2 volunteers who are willing do the job together as Co-VPs. The bylaws refer to the VP and VP-elect as herself/himself. That's it. Kate talked with several people in the Guild and no one sees a problem with have co-Vice Presidents. This is what is planned.

Kate asked for discussion or questions. There was none.

Raffle Quilt:

Awards

Currently, LQG has 2 awards: Life Member and Bright Star.

The Bright Star award is given to members for consistent achievement and effort toward the betterment of the Guild.

The Board has discussed the awards and decided to add a 3rd award at this time.

We re-worded the Bright Star description to:

LQG Bright Star Award – This is given to members for consistent achievement and continuing involvement for the betterment of the Guild over a period of time. (For achievement beyond the Shining Star level, but less that the level for a Life Member Award.)

We looked at all of the past recipients of the Bright Star award and they would fit the new definition.

The Board established a new award to be called the Shining Star award. It would be given to members for a significant contribution to the Guild. (It may be for a single project or for an ongoing project.) We will have pins made for this new award

The nominations form will be in the next Plain Print. It will also be available on the Guild web site.

Finance Committee Job Description in bylaws:

We have a conflict in the Job Description for the Finance Committee as it appears in our bylaws in Article 7, #3. It states: Finance Committee shall consist of four appointed members and the Treasurer, who shall serve as chair... And then later it says: ... The duty of this committee shall be to prepare the budget for presentation to the Guild at the April meeting, to be adopted at the

This is not how we have been functioning for several years.

The Board suggests The proposed change: four appointed members, the Treasurer-elect, and the Treasurer...for presentation to the Guild at the March meeting, to be adopted at the April meeting.

Article 7, #3 would read as follows:

Finance Committee shall consist of four appointed members, the Treasurer-elect, and the Treasurer, who shall serve as chair. Members of the Finance Committee shall serve a two-year term, with two new members being appointed each year by the Executive Board. In the event a member cannot complete the term, a member will be appointed by the Executive Board to fill the unexpired term. The duty of this committee shall be to prepare the budget for presentation to the Guild at the March meeting, to be adopted at the April meeting.

A bylaw change, according to Article 11, needs to be presented at one meeting, published in the Plain Print, and voted on by the membership at the following meeting.

We will vote on the bylaw change at the March meeting.

\$500 Policy:

We currently have a policy that says the Board may spend up to \$500. For any amount over that, the expenditure must be voted upon by the Guild.

The Board also discussed the idea of monies being donated to groups outside the Guild. The question arose as to what would happen if the Board decided to donate money to a group and the majority of the Guild was not in agreement. The Guild would not have any way to change this.

After discussion, the Board decided we need to address both issues and decided they should be added to the bylaws.

We would like to propose an amendment to Article 7, #3 to read as follows:

The Board is authorized to spend monies up to \$500 on Guild expenses. Amounts over \$500 must be presented to the Guild and put to a vote of the membership.

Any proposal to donate money to any group outside of LQG must first be presented to the Board. The Board would then present the proposal at a LQG meeting and put it to a vote of the membership.

Questions were raised over monies for the Quilt Show and the Bus Trip. These are included in the budget and are voted upon by the Guild membership. Anything else in the budget would also be covered.

Again, a bylaw change, according to Article 11, needs to be presented at one meeting, published in the Plain Print, and voted on by the membership at the following meeting.

We will vote on the bylaw change at the March meeting.

Memorial Policy:

Unfortunately the idea of a memorial policy has come up twice in the last few months. It will continue to come up in the future.

The Board decided we need to have some kind of policy in place. We discussed this during a couple of Board meetings. What to do and for whom were considered.

Our proposal is: LQG will honor a past President or Life Member upon their death with a \$25 memorial to the family to be used as the family desires.

Because of the proposed bylaw change, we thought this needed to come before the Guild. The amount is less than the current \$500 policy, but the money is going to an outside person or group as a donation. There was no discussion.

Motion by Dana Atteberry: LQG will honor a past President or Life Member upon their death with a \$25 memorial to the family to be used as the family desires. Second by Willa Smith. Motion passed.

November Mini Raffle Monies:

In the past, the Monies from the November Mini Raffle have sometimes been donated to Santa Socks. Other years, it wasn't.

In the overall terms of the LQG budget, that small amount of money won't make much of a difference. BUT to the Santa Socks, it would be a tremendous help in filling the socks and bags.

It's the Board's recommendation that from now on, monies from the November Mini Raffle will be donated to Santa Socks.

Motion by Sue McKee: November Mini Raffle monies should be donated to Santa Socks each year. Second by Martha Lane. Motion passed.

There was no other new business.

Old Business

Birthday Party:

Just a reminder...keep working on those cuddle quilts to turn in at our birthday party in March.

Also, Anita says there is a need right now for preemie quilts and crib liners for the hospital NICU. Check your previous Plain Prints for the sizes. If you have time to make these, please bring them to the March meeting.

Alzheimer's Priority Quilts:

Kate had the Priority envelopes here with her. If you have any quilts to turn in, bring them to me after the meeting.

The Little Pink Sewing Machine:

The sewing machine was donated by member Ann Howard to be sold (auctioned) by LQG and the money used as the Guild wants. Shelly Burge checked the value in one of her catalogues. It is valued at approximately \$75.

After discussion, the Board decided to hold the sewing machine until the next auction during the 2008 Quilt Show.

Committee Reports: Ricky Tims' Seminar:

Sheila Green reported she has 39 people registered for the. The 18 motel rooms she has reserved are all spoken for.

Friendship blocks:

Martha Lane has 2 sets of blocks which were won by Arlene Lynn and Sharlee Green. Martha showed the example of the shaded 9 patch block for next month.

Challenge:

Elizabeth Sterns and friends presented us with a little skit written by Joyce Donlan. The skit reminded us to turn in the Challenge registration forms (yellow form in your packet) at the March meeting.

Mini Raffle:

Dana Atteberry announced we raised \$62.50 tonight. Quilts donated by Kathy Cather, the Quilter Kitty (a fabric bundle, too), Martha Lane, and Maggie Copple were won by Carol Paulish, Eleanor Wakeman, Judy Dahlgren, and Jane Grabenstein-Chandler. - 1. No money is involved (beyond your initial cost for fabric).
- 2. The table will consist of an assortment of fabrics in these sizes:
 - a 9" squares
 - b. ¼ yards straight cuts or fat quarters
 - c. ½ yards
- 3. You trade one-for-one.
 - a. one 9" square for one 9" square, one ¼ yard for a ¼ yard, one ½ yard for a ½ yard.
 - b. You cannot trade a ½ yard for two ¼ yard pieces or vice versa.
 - c. The trade must be "like for like".
- 4. If you contribute a "unit", but don't find one you want that month, you will be given a coupon to redeem at a later meeting. Coupons do not expire; neither will they be replaced if lost.

Finance Committee

Job Description in bylaws:

We have a conflict in the Job Description for the Finance Committee as it appears in our bylaws in Article 7, #3. It states: Finance Committee shall consist of four appointed members and the Treasurer, who shall serve as chair... And then later it says: ... The duty of this committee shall be to prepare the budget for presentation to the Guild at the April meeting, to be adopted at the May meeting.

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The Board suggests The proposed change: four appointed members, the Treasurer-elect, and the Treasurer..... for presentation to the Guild at the March meeting, to be adopted at the April meeting.

Article 7, #3 would read as follows:

Finance Committee shall consist of four appointed members, the Treasurer-elect, and the Treasurer, who shall serve as chair. Members of the Finance Committee shall serve a two-year term, with two new members being appointed each year by the Executive Board. In the event a member cannot complete the term, a member will be appointed by the Executive Board to fill the unexpired term. The duty of this committee shall be to prepare the budget for presentation to the Guild at the March meeting, to be adopted at the April meeting.

A bylaw change, according to Article 11, needs to be presented at one meeting, published in the Plain Print, and voted on by the membership at the following meeting.

This was presented at the February meeting. We will vote on the bylaw change at the March meeting.

\$500 Policy:

We currently have a policy that says the Board may spend up to \$500. For any amount over that, the expenditure must be voited up on by the Guild.

In proofing this issue of Plain Print, it came to our attention that the \$500 spending policy amendment to the bylaws should not be part of the Bylaw Article 7, #3 which is for committee descriptions.

We will present a new version at the March meeting and vote on it at the April meeting.

"Cut-Ups" Friendship Block Delectable Mountains

Martha Lane and Donna Welte have been brain-storming to come up with a new "twist" in the monthly *Friendship Blocks*. This idea is simple and won't require a pattern. Just follow these instructions.

For those of you who won blocks at the February meeting or want to make some of your own. Here are the instructions to make the "Delectable Mountains".













Trim each block to 8" square

Cut block in half = 4"

Cut each half in half =2". Each section will be 2" x 8"









Sew strips together and you'll have a delectable mountain block


Shaded 9-Patch

Cut 8" squares from assorted fabrics (at least 2). Cut squares in half on the diagonal. Match a light to medium piece with a medium to dark piece and sew together on the diagonal. Repeat as many times as necessary to use up your squares that you cut.

Turn in at the March 12 meeting.


















Cut on the drawn line and press open.

You will have 2 half square triangles.
