

New Meeting Room: President Judy Lane:

In April, the budget was approved with a higher meeting room rent allowance to provide for the possibility of moving to the church's new addition when it is completed. We have been meeting in Fellowship Hall for 18+ years. We are grateful for this space but are also aware that we have outgrown this room. Over the years, the guild has added members and activities that require informational tables and display space. Within the past few weeks, Cathie Miller, Martha Lane, and I toured the new space, Heartland Hall. Here is what we learned:

- the room is considerably bigger than our current space (estimated 2x bigger)-there will be a new and improved microphone
- · there will be a pull-down screen that will make it easier for everyone to see photos,

etc.

- · the projector will be ceiling-mounted, a church staff person will run the equipment
- · numerous speakers will be located in the ceiling to enhance hearing
- there will be a stage area with an elevation of about 6-7"
- an elevator is nearby
- · restrooms are nearby
- both round and rectangular tables will be available for pre-meeting activities
- · addition meets Americans with Disabilities Act standards
- entrances on north, south, and east side of addition:

south - upon entering building there are both stairs and an elevator to get to Heartland Hall.

east – set of outside steps to reach entrance

north – drive through to allow for passengers to get out of car or unload

Heartland is on same level as north entrance

Parking: south - largest parking area, east - parking, *north* - unloading area near the door, some off-street parking.

- **Rental fee for meeting room space would be \$175.00 per month
- **There would be an additional fee for kitchen use

The completion date has been adjusted and it is hoped that the addition will be finished later in September. We have expressed our interest in making the move as soon as possible. At first, we hoped to make the move for the October meeting. This possibility depends on two factors: completion of the addition and church board response to our request to move. The church board meets next week and we must await their response as well as room readiness.

As the Guild Executive Board discussed the new location for our meetings, we talked about the increased fees and our desire, as paying guests, to help take care of a very special, long-awaited, and beautiful addition for the College View Seventh-day Adventist Church. We discussed whether or not we should continue snacks and beverages in the new meeting area. After careful discussion, the Executive Board made the following decision:

STARTING IN OCTOBER, NO FOOD WILL BE ALLOWED AT GUILD MEETINGS AND ONLY WATER IN CLOSED CONTAINERS MAY BE BROUGHT IN BY INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS.

This decision will go into effect even if we are not able to make the move in October. Members will be informed of the church board decision and building completion through the Plain Print. At this point, we are likely to be here in Fellowship Hall until November. If anyone wants to share comments and questions, please contact me by email or telephone. I hope that any perceived drawbacks are far outweighed by all the advantages of meeting in Heartland


A New Meeting Space and Refreshment Decision for LOG

Friendship Block of the Month: Batiks Squared

Due October 2007 meeting



Use three (3) different Batiks for each block you make. Any color choice will be OK as long as they contrast somewhat.

Color 1: cut one 21/2" square

Color 2: cut one 1½" x 2½" strip; two 1½" x 3½" strips and one 1½" x 4½" strip

Color 3: cut one 3" x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strip; two 3" x 7" strips and one 3" x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " strip

Refer to the diagram adding strips counter clockwise and pressing to the added strips. (Log Cabin style).

The block will be approximately $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ ". **DO NOT trim the block**. The winner will trim to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square
