

- Cut 5 inch squares
- Stack fabric squares in twos alter each pair at a 45 degree angle so it's easy to grab just two at a time.
- Place all trades in large "zip-lock type" bag labeled with your name.
- BRING TO MEETING Pick up your swap (27 pairs) at the following meeting!

Raffle Quilt Moms, Kate Laucomer and Martha Lane. Kate said 534 raffle quilt tickets have been sold. Chris Taylor has sold more than 100 tickets. Jaynee Wolfe made a mini quilt for a drawing for the individuals that quilted on the raffle quilt. Millie Fauquet won the mini quilt.

Cuddle Quilts, Anita Ahrens. Announced batting that machine quilters like to use in quilts is now available. She hopes that we make as many quilts this year as we did last year, which she thinks is 369 quilts. The current need is for preemie quilts size 24 or 30 inches square, backed with flannel. They also need crib liners. She encouraged everyone to bring a finished quilt for the LQG birthday celebration in March.

International Quilt Study Center/Nebraska State Quilt Guild, Sheila Green. Sheila showed different ways to dress up the sweatshirts and t-shirts that can be purchased for the IQSC. LQG Fabric Exchange Table

- 1. No money is involved (beyond your initial cost for fabric).
- 2. The table will consist of an assortment of fabrics in these sizes:
 - a 9" squares
 - b. ¼ yards straight cuts or fat quarters
 - c. 1/2 yards
- 3. You trade one-for-one.
 - a. one 9" square for one 9" square, one ¼ yard for a ¼ yard, one ½ yard for a ½ yard.
 - b. You cannot trade a ½ yard for two ¼ yard pieces or vice versa.
 - c. The trade must be "like for like".
- If you contribute a "unit", but don't find one you want that month, you will be given a coupon to redeem at a later meeting. Coupons do not expire; neither will they be replaced if lost.

The Connie Strope Memorial Award

Connie Strope was a past president of Lincoln Quilters Guild and a recipient of the "Lifetime Member" Award from LQG. She was also a member of several small quilt groups: the Faded Blossoms, the Basket Cases, Heart & Hands afternoon workshop, Evening Stars workshop, Discover Nebraska Educational Group, and other organizations outside of quilting.

She was a Charter member of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild, and a Radiant Star Award winner with NSQG. Connie loved being a volunteer with the International Quilt Study Center. She was a retired rural route postal carrier of 30 years service.

Connie loved quilts, quilting and quilters! She loved people! With a strong arm and shoulder to help where needed, Connie gave support that was unconditional. She had a great sense of humor! With charm and wisdom, and always with a smile, she had a joke or two to share with any group, for she knew laughter as a magic tool and used it often in the ribbons of friendship.

In April 2006, knowing Connie needed some "special sunshine" and TLC, a group of 30 quilters gathered (in secret) to create a Wild & Wacky, Warmth & Comfort Quilt (of humor) for Connie. We had a "Log Cabin Polka," and the group created a quilt of only ..POLKA DOTS!

Patriotic Neck Cooler Project

My husband, who works for the Veterans Administration

Medical Center here in Lincoln, has issued a challenge for me.

The National Wheelchair Veteran's Olympics will be held in Omaha next July. My husband has asked that I try to get several women from my quilting groups to make and donate neck coolers for the veterans participating in this event. The last Olympics had about 600 participants. To make 600 neck coolers figures out to about 85 yards of fabric as the pattern says you can get 8 neck coolers from 1 yard of fabric. I am asking members of the Guild if they would be willing to help out. There are three ways you can help out:

1) Donate some patriotic fabric. (Needs to be from selvage to selvage).

2) Give a donation towards some polymer granules to put in the neck coolers.

3) Donate some of your time in sewing some of the neck coolers (pattern, fabric and crystals would be provided). You would have until June 2008 to get these made. If you are willing to do this, just let me know what size kit you would like (8 neck coolers per yard).



Friendship Blocks

Liberated Log Cabin blocks • Red, Green and Cream


- 1. The name of this game is to be inconsistent.
- 2. Use scraps or strips from other projects if available. Otherwise cut the strips (logs) different widths and not necessarily the same width from one end of a strip to the other. You can even piece them if necessary.
- 3. Begin with a free cut square or rectangle no larger than two inches for the center. (*Free cut means using a scissors*). Centers need not be the exact same size or shape.
- 4. A suggestion is to use a red center with strips in cream and green and a green center with red and cream strips.
- 5. Logs can be built up more on one side than the other.
- 6. Make blocks approximently 7½ inches square. They don't have to be perfectly square when you turn them in as they will be trimmed to size by the person receiving them in November.




Bento Box - Nickel style

- 2 pair of nickel squares 1 light / 1 dark
- Cut two 2¼" strips from each square.
- Take ONE strip of each fabric
- Cut two 2¼" squares from each strip
- (Fig. 1) Sew 2¼" square to other fabric's 2¼" square
- (Fig. 2) Take 1 of the other strips and sew to 2 patch
- (Fig. 3) Take last 2 strips and finish last round of each Bento Box.
- Trim
