

"If I listen they will tell me" - or what I have learned from my quilts

Mary Sue Suit from Sidney, Nebraska says she is just a "start and see what happens" quilt maker. She has been quilting for about 30 years. Mary Sue is largely self-taught and is hooked on geometric piecing. Mary Sue has published four books, and designed a ruler to help with three of them. A New Twist on Triangles was featured on an episode of Simply Quilts.

Mary Sue's "Sawdust" quilt took 1st place at the IQS Houston Quilt Festival in Fall of 2007. Her quilts have also won awards at the Okalahoma winter quilt show, Machine Quilter's Showcase and AQS Nashville Quilt Festival.

Update on plans for the Virtual Gallery:

Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild - April 14, 2008

President Judy Lane called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Greg Jensen from the University of Nebraska Foundation thanked the Lincoln Quilters Guild members for their help with the International Quilt Study Center and Museum.

Quilt Show Committee

Chair - Elizabeth Sterns: Announced that the registrations for Quilt Show entries need to be in by May 3. Registrations will be in the Plain Print and on the LQG website. The preferred drop off location is the Weary Center on Tuesday, May 20 from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Volunteer registration forms were available for completion after the meeting. Elizabeth is still looking for one more wheelchair to be used at the show. She needs two green or black patio tables. An all committee meeting will be Thursday, April 17, at First United Methodist Church at 7:00 p.m. Elizabeth announced that the Distinctive Directions 2008 Creative Textile Art Invitational opened at the Lux Center for the Arts on April 4 and will continue thru April 26. Members that volunteer with the quilt show will have free admission on Friday and Saturday. Any member can get in free on Sunday, but it's best to volunteer.

Reception – Jo Anne Bair: Took a head count of members and their guests that plan to attend the reception before the Quilt Show to be held on Thursday, May 22.

Auctions – Sandy Anderson: Announced that separate bidding numbers are needed for the silent auction and the active auction. The silent auction will end Saturday at 3:30 p.m. They hope to have all items picked up on Saturday. If someone is unable pick up items purchased themselves, they should ask a designate to pick up their items.

Challenge Quilts – Marilyn Remboldt: Compass challenge quilts need to have a salmon colored registration form attached to it and turned in by the May meeting. A white registration form also needs to be submitted for Compass challenge quilts by May 3.

Registration – Lorelee Novak: Requested that registrations for quilts be turned in by May 3.

Security – Lora Yardley: Security is needed during the days of the show. There is also a need for separate security throughout the night. She requested volunteers.

Polo Shirts and Publicity - Kathi

Kinnaman: Nine people who ordered polo shirts still need to pick them up. Announced there will be six billboards advertising the Quilt Show throughout Lincoln.

Raffle Tickets – Kate Laucomer: Announced approximately 2,000 tickets have been sold, but there are still about 3,000 tickets to sell. 
