Speaker: Dr. Robert Hillestad Monday, May 11th • 7 pm

Robert Hillestad, emeritus professor of clothing, textiles, and design at the *University of Nebraska – Lincoln*, is a studio artist and design educator. He works with fiber and fabric to create wall pieces and sculpture for commercial and residential interiors, garments, accessories, and one-of-a-kind designs for individuals and families to celebrate special occasions. His work has been

shown in more than 150 juried and invitational shows in the United States and abroad and is included in many corporate, private and museum collections.

Dr. Hillestad has also been the recipient of awards including being designated a "Fellow" of the International Textile and Apparel Association. Images of his work have appeared in more than sixty publications. In 1997, *The Robert Hillestad Textiles Gallery* on the University of Nebraska campus was named in his honor.

Hillestad earned degrees in art and design at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and Drexel University in Philadelphia and a doctorate in Textiles and Clothing at Ohio State University.






Library Books Needed


Motion to close nominations by Rosalind Carr. Second by Dana Atteberry. Motion passed.

Friendship Block Exchange

Raw Edge Applique Sunflowers

Part I

Due May LQG meetings. Drawing for blocks at the May 2009 meeting.

Fabric required for each flower: Large flower: 8½-inch square Small flower: 5½-inch square Middle flower: 7-inch square

Center: 4-inch square

NOTE: There is no background fabric used for this flower.

Use different values of the yellow-gold family for flowers. Batiks, marble, tone on tone, as well as plaids, stripes and patterns. Just so there is contrast.

Center is dark brown. Plain or patterned is fine.

Fold the squares of fabric right sides together both horizontally and vertically. Press. A spritz of spray starch may help to stabilize.

Using the pattern below cut the flowers and center. *Mark the top of each.*

Beginning with the middle flower and matching center folds stitch to the large flower with very small zig-zag stitch ½ inch from the edge.

Turn to wrong side and cut away the large flower fabric leaving about ¼" from the stitching.


Turn to right side and attach the small flower to the middle flower. Again turn to the backside and trim.

Follow the same directions with the brown center and again turn to the back and trim the small flower fabric away.

You will turn this raw edge sunflower in for the drawing in May.

LQG Membership Survey Results

Thanks to 182 of our members who took the time to fill out the membership surveys at the April meeting! Preliminary results are in, complete results of our findings will come later. We are a very diverse group! Here are some early observations of an "average" member:

- · a quilter for 10-20 years
- a LQG member 10 years or less
- age group 60-69
- 81% live in Lincoln
- 19% live outside Lincoln
- 32% belong to other guilt guilds
- · 20% belong to an LQG sponsored small group
- 50% belong to another small group
- 53% label themselves "traditional" quilters
- 7% label themselves "art" quilters
- 33% label themselves both, art and traditional guilters
- 12% beginning guilters
- 64% intermediate guilters
- 22% advanced quilters
- 3% don't quilt, come for the programs and friendships
- 57% have visited the International Quilt Study Center & Museum
- 34% have visited the Public Library (for quilt books)
- 32% have visited the Hillestad Textiles Gallery
- 24% have visited the Museum of Nebraska History
- 69% have taken LQG sponsored classes

There is much more to be learned about each of you from this survey. Results will be shared and used in planning for next year. Thanks for your participation!
