President's Message

A HUGE thank you to everyone who helped with and provided quilts for the October *Memory Quilt*

program! Shirley and I couldn't have done it without you. We are grateful to the International Quilt Study Center and Museum, the Nebraska Historical Society and Art McWilliams for their permission to use several of the photographs used in the presentation.

Most of the quilts used were from you, our members, including many of our Founding and Charter members. What a joy to meet some of you for the first time, visit with you in your home about your quilting memories and photograph your precious quilts. This group of ladies rarely show quilts at our quilt shows or Show and Tell. We're pleased to honor members no longer with us, including Ernst Haight, Louise Howey, and Ruth Hicks. It was an unbelievable experience to meet Ernst Haight's daughter Mae Belle. I had the pleasure of making arrangements for her to see her father's quilt now at the International Quilt Study Center and Museum. The quilt was given to the Nebraska State Quilt Guild when Ernst and Grace Snyder became the first two members inducted into the NSQG Hall of Fame in 1986! Three of Ernst's quilts are in the book, <u>Nebraska Quilts and</u> <u>Quiltmakers.</u> I would loved to have met him.

The stories from your quilts were humorous, taught us about the Bible or history, commemorated an event, were used in fundraising or to highlight a social cause, helped with the grieving process as they told memories of a loved one. Jackie Greenfield shared her quilt, entitled "Sarah's Quilt," made to honor and remember her daughter who died at age 3½ of smoke inhalation in a fire at their home. She used an old, unique technique to construct the quilt, tile appliqué, using pieces of

Friendship Block Exchange 9 patch


Red, Green and Cream Batiks

Blocks due November 2009 for drawing Please use assorted <u>batik</u> prints of reds, greens and cream fabric.

Cut each color into 41/2" squares.

Each block will need:

Four Batik reds Four Batik greens One Batik cream





G

Four 4¹/₂" assorted **R**eds

Four 41/2" assorted Greens

One 4¹/₂" Cream

Sew the 9-patch block using the above diagram.

Please make sure <u>red</u> is used in each of the four corners.

Pressing information:

1strow – press toward the red

 2^{nd} row – press toward the cream

3rd row – press toward the red

Make lots of 9-patch blocks. The blocks should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Your name will be entered for each block you turn in.

Have fun and <u>please</u> use batiks in the blocks.
