Minutes of the Lincoln Quilters Guild - January 11, 2010

College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church – Lincoln, Nebraska

The meeting was called to order by President Sheila Green. A Parliamentary Committee has been secured and includes Jo Anne Bair, Dorothy Heidemann-Nelson, Emily Schmale, Rose Kastl and Zita Schneider.

Shirley Chaffin will moved that the order of the meeting be changed and that we ballot on the two proposals at the beginning of the meeting. The motion was seconded. The motion passed. Sheila stated that 25% or 90 of our members need to be present to vote. 174 members signed in to vote. Tonight's Balloting Committee is Rosie Westerhold, Lin Gowin-O'Brien, Janet Phillips, Wanda Hein, Ronda Bieber.

Diane Deahl made the motion for the Amendment change to our Bylaws):

"I propose that the Vision Committee be added to the Committees under article VII, changing its status to a Standing Committee." The motion was seconded by Judy Lane. The motion was restated and discussion followed. The membership voted.

Kris Vierra read the Gifting Proposal proposed by the Executive Board.

"According to our Bylaws, any expenditure over \$500 must be presented to the Guild and put to a vote of the membership. Reflecting on our mission to promote quilting education and experiences and considering the guild's 501 C3 not-for-profit status, the Executive Board recommends making contributions to the following Lincoln organizations:

- \$1,000 to the Lincoln Public Libraries for purchasing quilting related materials.
- \$1,000 to the Nebraska State Historical Society Museum of Nebraska History for the purchase of quilt related archival materials.
- \$1,000 to the Hillestad Gallery for their renovation project or education.
- \$5,000 to the International Quilt Study Center and Museum to purchase portable stools for the museum visitors and to have educational curriculum developed for a new permanent exhibit that will feature the Quilts in Common exhibition."

The motion was seconded by Jo Anne Bair. The motion was restated by Sheila and discussion followed. Linda Loker moved that we ballot for each organization separately. Seconded by Kate Laucomer. The motion was restated by Sheila. Discussion followed. The motion was defeated in a verbal vote. The original motion was voted upon by the membership. The results of the balloting occurred during New Business.

Shirley Chaffin, Vice President and Program Chair introduced Lois Wilson, our speaker for tonight. The program followed.

The *Minutes* of the November meeting were printed in the *January Plain Print*. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes and they stand approved as printed.

Advice from a 1949 Singer Sewing Manual

Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do . . . never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates. Never try to sew with a sink full of dirty dishes or beds unmade. When there are urgent housekeeping chores, do these first so your mind is free to enjoy your sewing.

When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible. Put on a clean dress. Keep a little bag full of French chalk near your sewing machine to dust your fingers at intervals. Have your hair in order, powder and lipstick put on.

If you are constantly fearful that a visitor will drop in or your husband will come home and you will not look neatly put together, you will not enjoy your sewing as you should.

The Gifting Proposal has passed. We are fortunate to be able to share our resources with other local organizations. We are fulfilling our purpose! We can make a difference!

From the Vision Committee

A look at some other quilt guilds -

How do we compare to other quilt guilds? This question was identified to be studied by the *Vision Committee* last fall.

We chose five quilt guilds in the Midwest which bracketed LQG in size: Cottonwood (Elkhorn Nebraska), Omaha Quilt Guild, Des Moines Area Quilters Guild, Prairie Quilt Guild (Wichita, Kansas) and Arapahoe County Quilters (Denver area). The membership in these guilds ranged from 200 to 800. Current LQG is above 350.

Initially, we gathered information from the respective web sites and then followed up with additional questions to the contact names listed. A summary of the data was compiled on a spreadsheet for easy sideby-side comparison.


Due February and March 2010 Drawing for blocks in March 2010

Block colors are pink and red. Prints may be used. Batiks work really well in this block. Any shade of pink or red is just fine. Make sure there is enough contrast between the red and pink to show as different values.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Blocks must be turned in as sets of <u>two</u>. Block 2 colors will be the <u>reverse</u> of Block 1

BLOCK 1 (6¹/₂" square – don't trim)

- Cut 4 2" squares RED (A)
- Cut 4 2" x 3¹/₂" rectangles PINK (B)
- Cut 1 $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square RED (A)



BLOCK 2 (6¹/₂" square – don't trim)

Cut 4 2" squares - PINK (A)

Cut 4 $2^{"} \times 3^{1/2"}$ rectangles - RED (B)

Cut 1 3¹/₂" square – PINK (A)

Piecing directions are the same as shown for BLOCK 1

Turn in as many blocks as you wish, but please be sure to turn in **Block 1 and Block 2**.

Your name will go into the drawing for each block turned in during February and March. *Aka "Puss in the Corner"


