Friendship Block Exchange/March/April 2011


6" Spool Block (Spool block will measure 61/2")

For EACH Block: Fabric A (the spool)

Cut one 2½" x 6½" strip of colored fabric Cut four 2½" squares of colored fabric

Fabric B (black background)

Cut two 2½" x 6½" strips of black fabric



Fold each square in half on the diagonal, with wrong sides together, and press to make a crease.

Place two squares at each end of both black strips, with right sides together. Stitch one thread outside the crease line. Trim the seam allances to 1/4"

Press one seam inward and one seam outward.

Join the three strips using ¼" seams. Press these seams to the inside. (Follow arrows for pressing).
