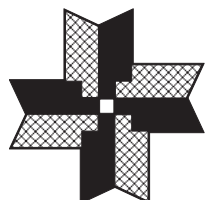
September Holders and Folders:

September Class with Pat Sloan

Learn to "Punch up" your appliqué quilt backgrounds. No more neutral tan or beige backings. Bring the color out and make your quilts sing! I'm really hoping that you bring fabric you love! I'd like you to bring a large selection of fabric to choose from, don't be frugal here! The first thing we'll do in the workshop is a color study, which is really fun! You need a selection of fabrics to play with for this to be as fun as possible.

What Appliqué technique can I use? This workshop does require a sewing machine for sewing the background of your quilt. Appliqué using the method you prefer, by hand or machine. I'm all about using the technique that works for you. Most of the class time is spent working on background selection and fabric choices for the appliqué. You won't do much appliqué in class unless that is your focus.

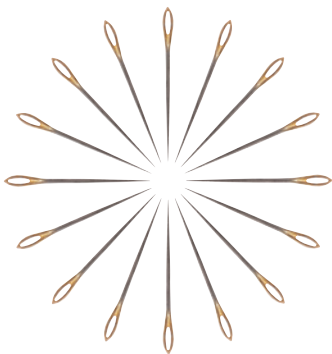

Ardis Butler James

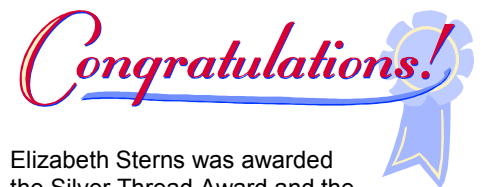
December 5, 1925

Her spirit and vision are evident in all aspects of the Quilt House. She will be sorely missed and remembered with deep respect and affection. Ardis James loved quilts and all things about quilting. Her legacy will live on in many ways, including one of her primary passions, the International Quilt Study Center & Museum.

Since the original donation of the Ardis and Robert James Collection in 1997 (1,000 quilts) and the establishment of the International Quilt Study Center, Ardis remained actively involved in the workings of the center. She celebrated the opening of the new museum in 2008 and most recently attended the latest IQSCM Symposium in March of this year. Ardis will be missed and remembered with love by her friends in Nebraska, all around the United States, and throughout the world.



Elizabeth Sterns was awarded the Silver Thread Award and the Nebraska State Quilt Guild Meeting in Kearney In July. She was honored with this award for her work in establishing and all her work with the Young Artists Program.

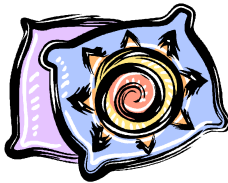
Quilts for Community

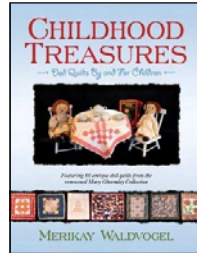
National Quilting Day 2012

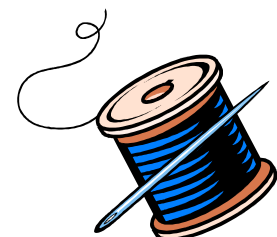

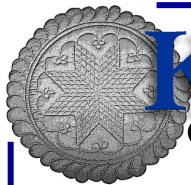

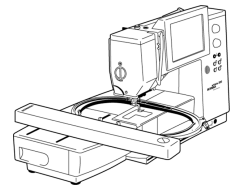
