Old Business

Sheila Green reported that every year the Lincoln Quilt Guild offers a scholarship. She, Pat Hackley and Janet Price are committee members. They distributed flyers – online and in person. There is an April 1st deadline for submission.

Sheila asked for a show of hands of members who would be interested in receiving a printed guild membership book. The cost of this would be approximately \$2-3. Your membership dues must be paid by tonight to make it into the book. Contact DeEtte Turgeon to see if you are current.

National Quilting Day is this coming Saturday from 9-3pm. There is an excellent program featuring some of our guild members among others. This year you can go into the conservation work room and learn about the teachers and staff and their work. There is a nice crazy

quilt display and the demonstrations are on handiwork. Quilts of Valor is the museum's outreach program this year. There will be a special presentation of a Quilt of Valor at 2pm to a Vietnam vet. This quilt, "Welcome Home", was designed and made by Laura and Lou Lenzen. The galleries are now open. Parking should not be an issue this year – over 200 spaces are available across the street at the Hardin Center. You can park in those lots even though it says they are restricted. Aurofil, AcuQuilt and Handi-Quilter are commercial sponsors this year.

National Quilting Day 2015 Report

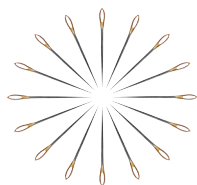
Our 6th annual National Quilting Day was held Saturday, March 14, 2015.

The event attracted over 450 guests from a several state area. Beautiful weather enticed many quilters and families to come out and enjoy the day. A big THANKS to our 96 volunteers, the Museum Staff, and our sponsors: Lincoln Quilters Guild, the Nebraska State Quilt Guild, Aurifil, Handi Quilter and Accu-quilt!

We had new areas this year as an alternative to our very popular Lectures: Collection Care in Action and Crazy Quilt Craze. This was the very first time that guests were allowed in the Conservation Workroom! The Crazy Quilt featured quilts on loan from guild members. The exhibit will hang in the 1st floor gallery until March 30. The museum offered an a la carte lunch for our guest to purchase. What a great enticement to have them re-fuel and take advantage of all we had to offer. All of our offerings related to exhibitions in our galleries. We featured a broad variety of Handwork demonstrations. Our volunteers showed many techniques and we had a couple of hands-on activities for our guests to try. Our display of International textiles was a big hit! The Quilts of Valor looked wonderful as you walked up the grand staircase. Right in the middle of the room, was the spectacular Quilt of Valor, "Welcome Home," that was awarded to Vietnam Vet, Roger Drucker of Lincoln, in a very touching ceremony by 4-H youth from the York area! Lincoln Quilt Guild members are invited to attend a lecture and workshop being held at the International Quilt Study Center & Museum April 17 and 18.

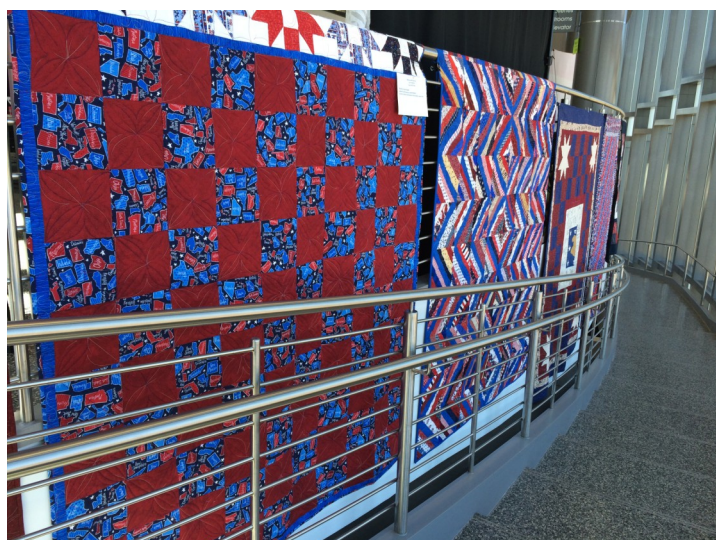
Artist and author Victoria Findlay Wolfe will present “Quilts: Making, Giving and Sharing JOY” on April 17 following a reception,

Call 402-472-6549 to order a ticket to one or both of these events.

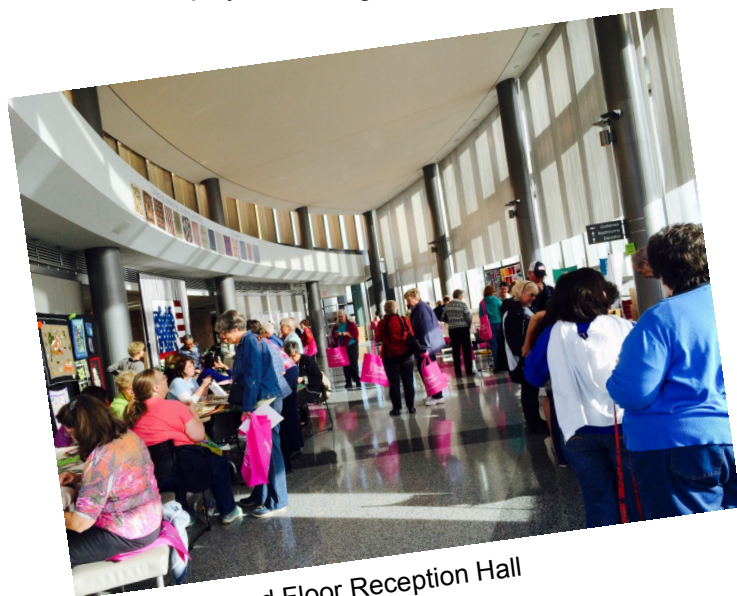

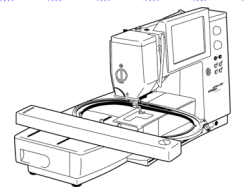
