International Quilt Museum (IQM) Liaison – Ann Hauder

The new exhibition at the International Quilt Museum is called NEW VIEWS: SHAPESHIFTERS. Shapeshifters inaugurates the New View exhibition series in which quilts collected over the last 20 years will be exhibited at the IQM for the first time. Made between 1830 and 1930, the quilts in Shapeshifters all have features that make them original or unique. My favorite is Gazelle made by Bertha Stenge that features polka-dotted gazelles feeding on large Art Deco plants. The exhibition will be on display from September 27, 2019 to March 29, 2020.

The latest exhibition at the museum is entitled the THE STORY QUILTS OF RUMI O'BRIEN. As a Japanese-American, Rumi O'brien expertly combines the folk-art traditions of both countries to create a hybrid quilting style of her own. Her delightful story quilts center on the theme of adventure, both the everyday and the imaginary, as

Rumi and her friends dig ponds, hunt for morel mushrooms, make friends with fish, cross mountains and dance on Jell-O. The exhibition will be on display from October 2, 2019 to April 12, 2020.

The 6th Annual Friends of IQM Art Market will be held November 22-23 at the museum. In addition to area artists selling their jewelry, pottery, hand-dyed scarves and wooden works of art, the Friends table will be selling artsy and/or quilt-related items donated by you. One hundred percent of the proceeds from your donation goes to the quilt museum. Please bring your donations to IQM by our November meeting or take them directly to IQM. 2020 Quilt Show – Vicky Skuodas & Joan Yoder

1,000 raffle tickets have been sold. To recognize this ticket sales effort, a mini-quilt made by Vicky Skuodas was awarded to Marge Bunde who was drawn from entrants who purchased tickets. When 1,500 raffle tickets have been purchased, another mini-quilt made by Vicky will be awarded. Tickets can be purchased from Quilt Coordinator, Kathy Bangsund.

Cuddle Quilts – Vicky Skuodas

The end of the year plans for Cuddle Quilts are: Home Instead (need approximately 30 quilts for both male and female, and have 15). Two Lincoln Public Schools serving low income families that have not already served will be identified. Bonnie Moses is making a selection, and getting permission from their staff. The 5th grade classes are identified as a good group to gift which means a need of between 175 to 200 quilts. There are

about 30 completed quilts available. Cuddle Quilts would be delivered in December, before school is out for the Christmas break. If you have Christmas fabric or panels you would like to use up, one of these projects might just fit the bill. Remember that jelly roll race quilts use up fabric quickly, and if it is cut in 3" or 3.5" widths, it goes even faster! Quilt sizes for the adults could be a bit larger, but the standard 45" x 55" would be acceptable for 5th graders.

Placemat Project – Caroline Forstrom & Janiece Goin

Members have already started to submit placemats for Meals on Wheels need of 500 placemats by December of 2020. Size recommendation is 13 x 18. Samples of submitted placemats were displayed. Caroline Forstrom, Jerry Lee Jensen and Kathie Baumbach will be collecting the placemats.

Budget - Caroline Forstrom & President Christina Chapman

Copies of the 2020/2021 proposed budget were available for those in attendance.

Last month, Caroline shared the Finance Committee's report and members were notified of the Finance Committee's motion to adopt the projections for the next 2 years as the budget for those two years. The floor was opened to discussion after the following instructions were read: "In order to ensure an orderly discussion, here are the ground rules: We will first allow up to 15 minutes of additional Q and A where Caroline addresses any member questions that are factual in nature or seek to understand the Finance Committee's reasoning. After that, if there are any members who wish to make a motion to amend the budget, I will explain those procedures in detail. The report was presented verbally last month, a copy was included in the Plain Print and paper copies are available around the room tonight. At this time, please come forward if you have a question of fact or reasoning by the Finance Committee."

There were no questions and no amendments to the proposed budget. Sheila Green made a motion to accept the budget as presented. Carol Curtis seconded the motion which was approved.

Programs – Marilynn Schnepf and Julie Albrecht

Members were reminded of the upcoming programs that are listed on the LQG website. Lea McComas was introduced as the October program presenter. Members were reminded that there were still openings for her class to be held on Tuesday.
