Minutes of the Last Meeting

Lincoln Quilters Guild Meeting Monday, November 8, 2021 College View Seventh Day Adventist Church

The meeting was called to order by President Lisa Burham with members and guests welcomed to the Guild meeting. She recognized the Lincoln Modern Quilt Guild's raffle quilt on display.

Old Business

- 1. The minutes of the October meeting were included in the Plain Print emailed to guild members and published on the guild website. Seeing no corrections, the October 2021 minutes were approved.
- 2. The September and October Treasurer's Reports were included in the latest Plain Print. Seeing no questions or corrections, the reports were remanded for audit.

New Business

Announcements:

1. Lisa Burham - President:

- a. Lisa shared her appreciation for the many individuals who have made LQG such a successful organization through their service and contributions throughout 2020 and 2021: Board members; Committee and small group members; Quilt Show chairs and committee; Raffle quilt makers and coordinators; Silent Auction committee, donors, and volunteers; Cuddle quilt makers; Mini Quilt Raffle donors; Isles sale donors and helpers; Nametag coordinator; Webmaster; workshop participants; and those members who have participated faithfully in attending meetings and programs.
- b. Lisa indicated that there are still openings on the Scholarship committee (1 position), Nominations committee (3 positions), and New Members group leaders (1 position), and members are asked to contact Lisa as soon as possible if they are interested.

2. Connie Soucie -- President elect, announced the following:

- a. Members were encouraged to renew their membership by December 31 to take advantage of the early-bird discount – after the meeting or by mail (form available online).
- b. Important dates for 2022:
 - i. Isles Sale tentatively planned for the end of March (watch for email announcements). Members were encouraged to begin a donation stash prior to the March meeting.
 - ii. The June guild meeting has been changed to the second Monday of June, to be consistent with all other guild meetings.
 - iii. The Lancaster County Fair scheduled July 28 through August 6.
 - iv. The Nebraska State Fair scheduled August 26 through September 5.
 - v. National Quilting Day is March 19, 2022, at the IQM.

- 3. **Bernina \$25 gift certificate -** Kathy Schmitter announced Sherry Taylor as the November winner.

4. Silent Auction - Sherry Taylor:

a. A thank you was given to everyone who helped to make the Fall FUNdraiser a success, including attendees, those who brought guests, or donated auction items (99 items). Also, Silent Auction Committee members, Lisa Burham, Kathi Schmitter, Chris Taylor and Roddy Humeniak were recognized for their invaluable assistance. Other volunteers the day of the event included: Christina and Larry

- b. With some expenses still outstanding, Sherry estimated that the net profit should be close to \$5.400.
- c. Some event details included: 120 admission tickets sold, 100 registered bidders (45 members and 55 guests). Attendees were from Nebraska, California, Colorado, Iowa, Illinois, Kansas, Maryland, and Missouri.

5. National Quilting Day - Sheila Green announced the following:

10. LQG Scholarship update – Natalie Cummings announced the following:

a. The Scholarship Committee has been working toward increasing awareness of the LQG scholarship, broadening the interest group for the scholarship, and simplifying the application process including the option to complete the application online. The committee will pursue communication of scholarship availability to Lincoln educational agencies that potentially have students qualified for application.

11. November Program (The 1970s and 80s Nebraska Quilt Revival): The following speaker introduction was provided by Lois Wilson:

a. Dr. Jonathan Gregory is the International Quilt Museum Assistant Curator of Exhibitions and over-sees production of its many exhibition projects. He earned an MA in Textile History and a PhD in Human Sciences from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. His research, curatorial work, and writing pursue twentieth century American quilt making, particularly in relation to social engagement and meaningmaking. Dr. Gregory has contributed to several IQM publications, including: American Quilts in the Modern Age, 1870 – 1940, and to IQM's "World Quilts" website (World Quilts.guiltstudy.org).
