STATE FAIR INFORMATION

For those of you that are thinking of entering some of your needlework in the fair this year, here is some information that just may help!!

1. Entry blanks properly filled in must be received in the office of the Manager State Fair, Lincoln, by Wednesday, August 13. Local exhibitors are requested to bring their exhibits to the Exposition Building, between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. All exhibits must be received in the Needlework Department, Exposition Building, State Fair Park Lincoln by Friday, August 22, 6:00 p.m.

2. Best in County: Entry and Exhibit will be accepted until Friday, August 29, 9:00 a.m. and will be judged on Friday, August 29 at 1:30 p.m. Exhibits must be marked Best in County and entered on special forms provided by and signed by the County Needlework Superintendent or the County Agent. All articles must be clean and show no wear.

3. Competition is limited to Nebraska exhibitors only. Exhibits will be released Sunday, September 7 from 4:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Exhibitors wishing their entries returned by Parcel Post must make this notation on the entry form. Also they must include sufficient postage, in an enclosed envelope for the return of the entry.

4. All articles must be the work of one exhibitor, except in Premium quilts #2457, "Quilting Bee Special"

5. The Stearns Technical Textiles Company will award a Mountain Mist quilt batt to the first place Blue Ribbon winner in Lot 10, 2447, 2449, 2450 and to the Best Item in Lot 10, and in Lot 14, 2504 and 2506. If you have a "Best of Show" winner in your quilt division, we will award \$25.00 and "Best of Show" ribbon.
