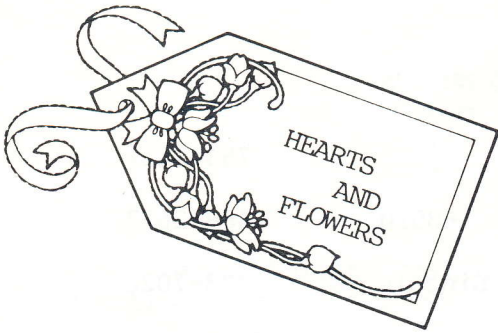


THE WOVEN THREAD

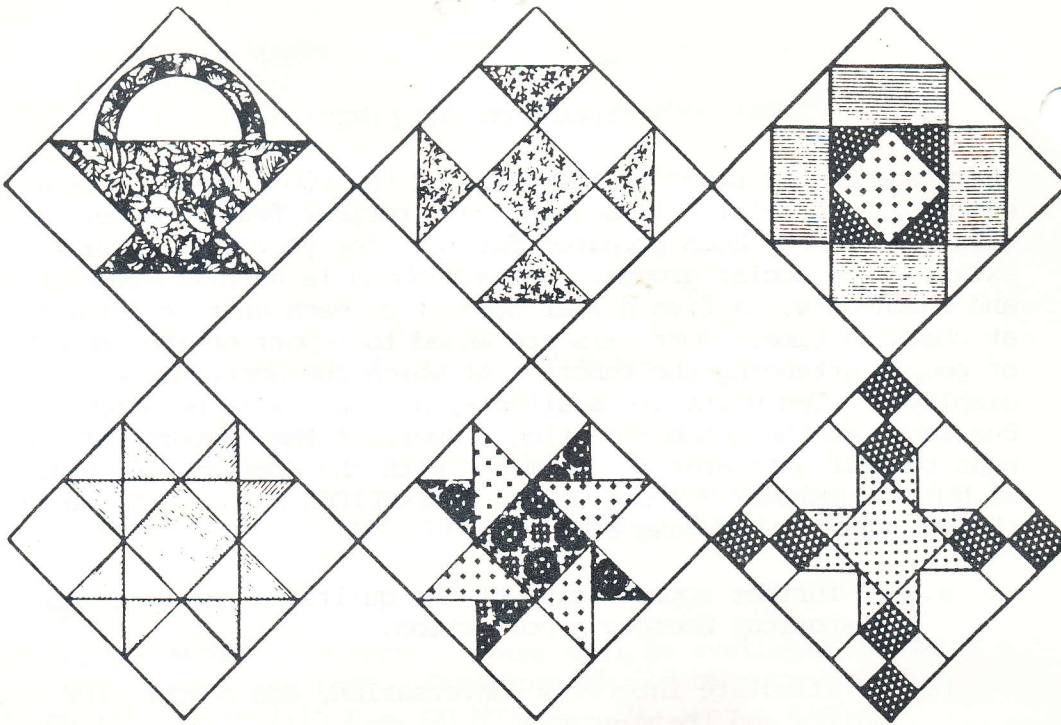
THE IN'S AND OUT'S OF LQG LIBRARY
