





Ship Block For the February meeting

For one block:

1. Cut 1 background square 6.5 x 6.5" from background fabric.



- 2. If doing fusible applique, trace pieces onto fusible. You may reverse the templates, OR not. Your choice. (Editor's note: The pattern is printed at 50% of the original.)
- 3. Fuse to fabrics. Cut out.
- 4. Position waves at botton of block. Position ship and sails. (Waves overlap the ship.) Iron pieces into position.
- 5. Do a blanket stitch or some other stitch (by hand or machine) to cover raw edges. We suggest using black thread for the applique. OR applique by hand the old fashioned way!

Note: You will need to make one block for your personal bonus quilt.

An Invitation to Explore the American Quilt Study Group Research Library Collection

If you are looking for something to do this winter, why not explore the resources of the American Quilt Study Group (AQSG) Research Library Collection? A significant resource for quilt scholarship, the AQSG Research Library Collection was developed over many years through generous donations to AQSG from individuals, organizations, groups, and corporations. The scope of the AQSG Research Library Collection is broad and deep in categories about quilts, quiltmakers, the craft of quilting, textiles and related subjects. It earned an international reputation as a vital and respected source for quilt history scholars and all who love quilts. The library collection

continues to grow and thrive today because of AQSG's committed donor support.

Two and a half years ago the AQSG Research Library Collection of nearly 3,000 items was transferred to the University of Nebraska libraries. This decision by the American Quilt Study Group, to place the library collection within a university library, allows AQSG to focus on the continued development of the collection and its care. Today there are over 5,500 individual items designated as part of the in the University libraries. This phenomenal growth is made possible by financial donations and donations of library materials through the American Quilt Study Group. This past year alone, significant works donated to AQSG by the National Quilting Association, Michael James, and Jonathan Holstein became part of the AQSG Research Library Collection.

The AQSG Research Library Collection exists in three categories: circulating materials such as books and journals available at C.Y. Thompson Library; rare and one-of-a-kind items, for example the research files and papers of Sally Garoutte and other individuals, a premier collection of exhibition catalogs, exhibition posters, and extensive quilt ephemera, found in the Archives and Special Collections of Love Library; and finally the study collections of quilts, textiles and swatch books. These textile items are currently "in process" as far as decisions about where and how they will be housed and cared for.

Over the years AQSG has faithfully collected quilt guild newsletters of its member groups. During the summer of 2000, an agreement was reached with the University libraries wherein those newsletters will be bound and placed on the shelves in the circulating collection.

As you find yourself with some free time this year, you are invited to browse the shelves in the University libraries and discover the rich resource placed there by the American Quilt Study Group. Our mission includes a statement about promoting the highest standards for quilt-related studies which is well served by our continued opportunity and responsibility to develop and care for the American Quilt Study Group Research Library Collection.
