Lincoln Quilters Guild Meeting Monday, November 13, 2023– 7:05 p.m. Minutes

<u>President Nancy Anderson called the meeting to order</u> and welcomed members and guests to the last meeting of the 50th Anniversary Year of LQG.

- 100 Members attended the meeting
 - 6 New members joined
- 12 Guests were in attendance

Nancy shared the beautiful ribbon Melonie Schatz made for Best of Show for quilts for the Lancaster County Fair. This ribbon will be awarded to Bonnie Kucera.

Old Business

- Minutes of the October 2023 meeting were included in the Plain Print.
 There were no changes, the minutes were approved as sent.
- The Treasurer's report for the month of October 2023 was also included in Plain Print. There were no corrections. The report will be filed by the president for audit.

New Business

Fiftieth Anniversary

- Nancy thanked past and current members of the board, committee members and everyone who has worked over the past 50 years to make the guild such a success.
- This year we averaged 112 members per meeting. Our current membership is right at 200.
- We had a total of 32 guests this year.
- Nancy thanked Pam Rowland, the Guild's membership chair, for providing this information.
- Nancy thanked Joyce Nass for answering the Guild's emails and keeping the website up to date.
- Nancy shard that we are fortunate that three current members of LQG were also members in 1973 when the Guild started: Millie Corkill, Pat Hackley and Frankie

Best. Each of these members was presented with a beautiful arrangement of fresh flowers.

- Frankie Best no longer lives in Lincoln and was not able to attend the meeting.
 - She sent her congratulations and said she has many fond memories of the Guild.
 - She especially appreciated the fact that the Guild members supported each other.
- Pat Hackley talked about her early years with the Guild.
 - A guilt show that was held at the Sheldon Museum of Art in 1974.
 - Norman Geske, the director of the Sheldon was not supportive of the idea and made comments about not wanting women in frilly aprons running around the Sheldon. At the closing banquet, after a very successful show, the Guild gifted Mr. Geske his own frilly apron.
 - This was one of the first quilt shows in the country to be held at an art museum.
 - The show set attendance records for the museum, which was held for many years.
 - The 1977 National Quilt Symposium was another huge undertaking of the Guild.
 - It was the first time many women had traveled alone or really done anything outside their home.
 - The Symposium made \$10,000 profit for the Guild, when many expected it would cost the Guild money.
 - A rule of the Symposium was that dealers could not buy guilts.
 - In 1991 LQG hosted the National Quilt Association.
 - This was a wonderful event that involved the whole community and the whole state.
 - At this meeting it was voted to make the third Saturday in March, National Quilting Day.
 - There were 10,000 visitors.
 - 1991 also saw the publication of Nebraska Quilts and Quiltmakers.
 - Frankie Best gave up her living room for three years while the publication was being worked on.
- Millie Corkill was president of the Guild 1979-1980.
 - Millie learned about quilting from responding to a flyer in a local fabric shop.
 She took a class from Mary Ghormley.
 - Mary told her to come to the Guild meetings.
 - o Millie felt like she was learning a new language when she started quilting.
 - Millie said over the course of her quilting life she has worn holes in several sterling silver thimbles.
 - Over the years there were quilt shows in every imaginable public space, Harris House, NBC.

- A high point was an opportunity to meet Grace Snyder. Millie was on the quilt hanging committee to hang "Flower Basket Petit Point," so she had the chance to touch that magnificent quilt!
- Millie shared the best part of the Guild is the friends she has made.
- She talked about a meeting held with the IRS when Guild board members had to apply for non-profit status after they had made a profit.
- Millie's advice to current members is "always make one block before you cut out the entire quilt."

Awards: Jaynee Wolfe

Bright Star Recipient- Lisa Burham

This honor is awarded to an LQG member for consistent achievement and continuing involvement for the betterment of the Guild over a period of time.

- Lisa demonstrates the grace and kindness of a great leader.
- She navigates discussions with strong personalities easily, and with immense patience. There have been many side projects with this year of celebration, and she has steered our committee into completion of each of those visions.
- Lisa led the Guild through the toughest year of any organization: The COVID pandemic. She led the Board through all the difficult decisions of that time period:
 - o Do we cancel the next Guild Meeting?
 - Do we need to renegotiate with the planned speaker(s)?
 - Will it be safe for our members and guests? How will this affect our budget?
 - o Can we afford this?
- Then she led the Board to stay on for an additional year, reasoning that the membership had basically lost the full year of experiences with the Guild.
- In addition, the Board suspended Guild dues for the next year to make up for the lost year.

 - The design radiates from that point, illuminating the love that was sent forth from the initial vision of those 4 wonderful ladies.
 - The lavender quilting holds more than 85 "shadow" stars. Those represent our Guild members that are no longer with us.
 - We feel that every member, past or present, has brought us to this point in time, where we are constantly amazed at the good fortune that brought us all together for the love of quilting.
