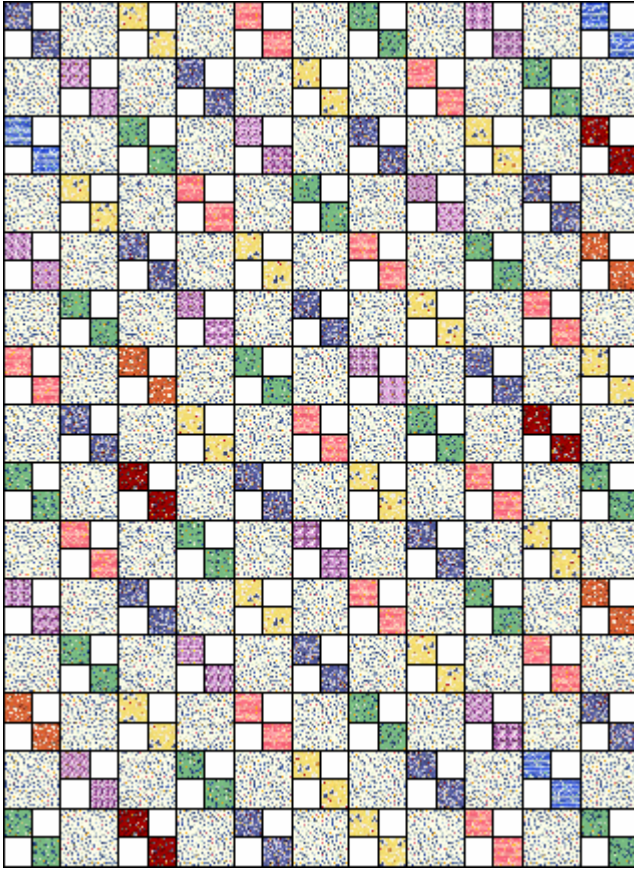
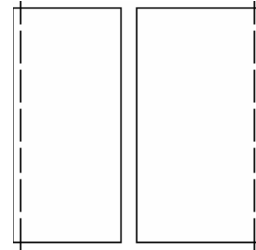
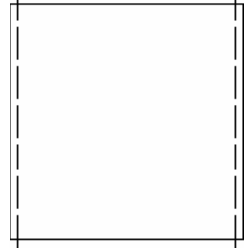


Double 4 Patch – 66" x 90"

PLEASE read all directions before starting

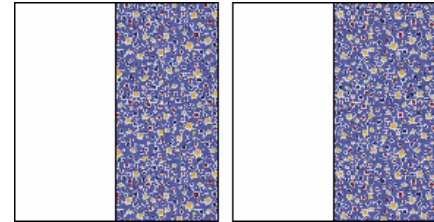


4. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam down right edge and down left edge.

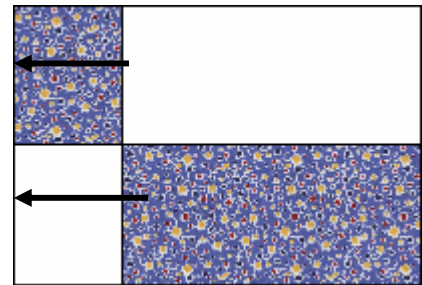


5. Cut down middle... $3\frac{3}{4}$ " from right and left edges.

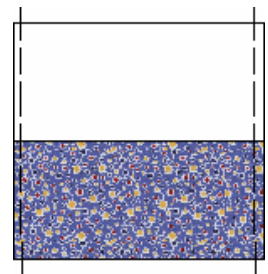
Now you will have 2 pieces that look like this.



6. Place the 2 pieces so that right sides of blue rectangles touch right sides of white rectangles.



7. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam down right edge and down left edge.

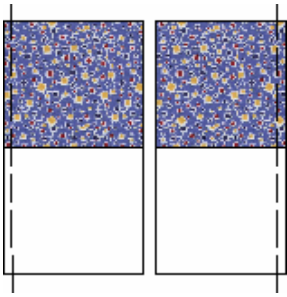


Materials:

- $2\frac{3}{4}$ - 3 yd. alternate block fabric
- $2\frac{1}{4}$ yd. light fabric
- $2\frac{1}{4}$ yd. colored fabrics (large enough to get a $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square from the piece)
- crib batt
- $5\frac{1}{2}$ yd. backing fabric
- $\frac{1}{2}$ yd. binding fabric *

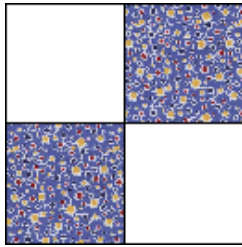
* more if making bias binding

1. Cut 82 – $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from alternate block fabric.
2. Cut 42 – $7\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from colored fabrics. (In directions, this will be called the dark fabric.)
Cut 42 – $7\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from light fabrics.
3. Place 1 - $7\frac{1}{2}$ " light square and 1 – $7\frac{1}{2}$ " dark square right sides together.



8. Cut down middle...
3 3/4" from right and left
edges.

When you open them up, you should have
two 4 patch blocks that look like this:



9. Repeat with remaining light and dark
squares. You should end up with 84 – 4 patch
blocks. This will give you one extra block.

10. Lay out your quilt top with 11 blocks in
each of 15 rows. Use the picture as a guide.

11. Sew rows together.
Press well.

12. Cut backing into 2 equals length pieces.
Sew pieces together.
You will have a vertical
seam in your quilt back.



13. Layer:
backing (right side down)
batting
top (right side up)

Baste.

14. Quilt as desired.

15. Cut 8 – 2" strips for binding.
Sew together into one continuous strip.
Press seam allowances open.
Fold binding in half (meeting long edges)
with wrong side in. Press.

16. Sew binding to quilt.
Hand stitch binding to back of quilt.

17. Cut a 3" x 4 1/2" rectangle from muslin or
white fabric (plain is best). Press under 1/2" on
all edges. Stitch to the back of the cuddle quilt.
That's it. You don't have to write anything on it.
When Anita gets your finished cuddle quilt,
she'll stamp on your muslin label. She has a
stamp that puts all of the LQG information on
the label.
