Monday, March 10, 2025, at 7:00pm

President Vicky Skuodas—Vicky called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and welcomed those attending.

Minutes from the November 11, 2024 meeting were published in the Plain Print and were approved. The treasurer's reports for November, January, and February were published in the Plain Print and were approved.

Vicky reported that there were 3-4 visitors and welcomed them. She also invited them to join the Guild.

President-Elect Liane Connelly—Liane gave the following announcements.

Liane read a thank you note from Chris Taylor, who received the Bright Star Award from the Guild.

The Newbies Group meeting is March 17 at Anderson Library from 5:45 to 7:45. The Isles Sale is March 30th from 10 to 3. Entry is a can of food for the Food Bank, or \$1. Cash or check only are accepted. No charge cards. There is an ATM nearby if needed.

The Omaha Modern Quilt Show will be held on April 4-6 at the Tri-Faith Initiative Commons, located at 13136 Faith Plaza in Omaha.

Committee Reports—

Quilts of Valor--Sara Kenny reported that there have been more than 400,000 quilts awarded nationally since the start of QOV. Almost 6,000 quilts have been awarded in Nebraska and just under 1,000 quilts have been awarded in Lincoln. Sara thanked the

Guild for all the help the members have given to this patriotic project. She asked for help in longarming the quilts. She requested that those interested and willing to help to leave contact information at the QOV table. Lincoln QOV leader, Kathie Miller will get in touch. Batting and backing are provided.

National Quilting Day-- Kathy Junker represented the National Quilting Day committee. She invited the group to attend the National Quilting Day celebration on Saturday, March 15th at the International Quilt Museum. Fliers have been distributed. There will be lectures/presenters, demos, quilt displays by the Cuddles group, and a make-it-take craft project for all ages. The Quilt Museum will also be open. All of this will be free! Lunch will be available for purchase.

Kathy thanked all the volunteers who had signed up to help and suggested people could check with Sheila Green at the sign-up table in case more help is needed for back-up. All places are filled!

Raffle Quilt Reveal and Sales Ticket Blitz—Vicky introduced raffle quilt makers Patrice Steiner and Sandy Montooth., unveiled this Guild year's raffle quilt! Sandy and Patrice gave information about the quilt. It's called Autumn Garden and is based on a Laundry Basket pattern from 2008. They decided to do a more traditional quilt. Patrice said there are more than 120 different fabrics from their scrap stashes! The quilt was unveiled to applause.

Patrice pointed out the applique designs in the border were created by Sandy. They were not part of the original pattern. Patrice has also donated the quilt display rack to the Guild. A sales ticket blitz ensued. Tickets are \$2 each or \$20 a book.

Mini-Raffle Quilts—Natalie Cummings announced that \$107 was raised in ticket sales for the Mini-Raffle.

Vice-President for Programs Mary Link—Marty acknowledged the work of last year's Vice-President for programs, Jackie and Rebecca. They had coasters and fat quarters for Guild members who were holders and folders. Some had not been picked up. Marty directed people to the Programs table where samples are on display for future workshops, along with class registration sheets. The sign-up sheets are also available on-line. April's speaker is Rochelle Rice and her class will be mosaics. The other class example is a scrappy paper pieced pineapple quilt block for May.

Marty introduced Deanna Faimon, who lives in Wilber. Deanna showed us many of her quilts. She explained how her techniques were influenced by other quilt artists and how she developed her own techniques, which are unique and stunning.

After Deanna's presentation, the meeting was adjourned to show and tell.
